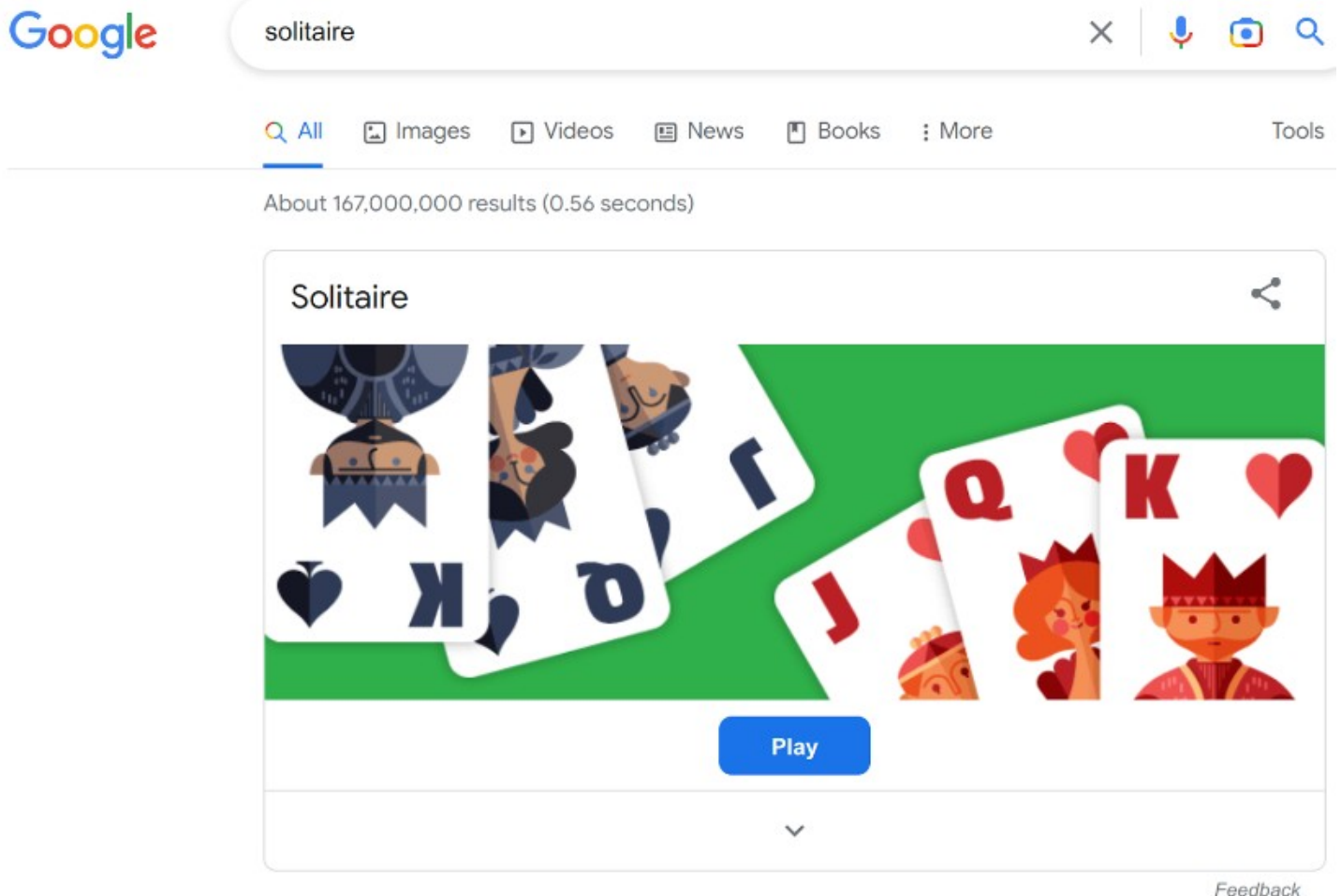


Using Google





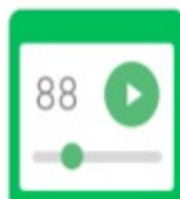

Flip a coin



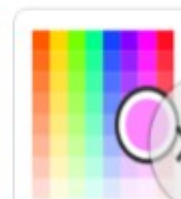
Spinner
